




Dear Democrats,



Call to Action

Please see below for more information on House and Senate Bills that are ready for floor votes next week.

Contact Representatives regarding:

- **VOTE NO on HB 543**, the permitless carry gun bill that is falsely named and will harm public safety;
- **VOTE NO on HB 1 the expanded School Voucher program**, will move money from public schools to private schools with little oversight;
- **VOTE NO on HB 837 Civil Remedies**, the expansive tort reform bill that will make it harder for victims to seek justice;
- **VOTE NO on HB 225 Interscholastic and Intrascholastic Activities**, the bill that wants to give the governor total control over the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA);
- **VOTE NO on HB 477 Term Limits for District School Board Members**, would reduce term limits of school board members from 12 years to 8 years;
- **VOTE YES on HB 19 Individual Education Plans**, the bill that would include ways in which students with IEPs could provide informed consent to allow parents to continue to participate in educational decisions;

Contact Senators regarding:

- **VOTE NO on SB 150 Public Safety**, the permitless carry gun bill that is falsely named and will harm public safety;
- **VOTE NO on SB 360 Causes of Action Based on Improvements to Real Property**, revises time in which action founded on design, planning, or construction of improvement to real property must be commenced;
- **VOTE YES on SB 144 Lactation Space in Courthouses**, requires at least one lactation space in each county courthouse for breastfeeding mothers to pump or feed their babies.

Legislative Member Highlights

This week marked the start of the Florida Legislative Session, and our Democratic members of the Florida House and Senate are hard at work, striving to pass legislation that will provide much-needed assistance to everyday working families. Their focus ranges from initiatives to guarantee access to healthy food for low-income Floridians, to proposals to grant well-deserved raises to our outstanding teachers. With an unwavering commitment to the well-being of their constituents, the Florida Democratic Legislators are fighting tirelessly for us. Below, we've highlighted just a few of the bills that have been filed by our exceptional State Senators.

SB 114: Tax Exemption for Diapers and Incontinence Products by Leader Book

SB 114 exempts the sale of diapers, incontinence undergarments, incontinence pads, and incontinence liners from the sales and use tax. Please click the button above to read more about the bill.



SB 342: Minimum Base Salary for Full-time Classroom Teachers by Sen. Berman

The "Save Our Teachers Act" will increase the minimum salary for teachers to \$65,000 per year. Please click the button above to read more about the bill.



SB 292: Healthy Food Financing Initiative Program by Sen. Jones

The bill directs the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to establish a Healthy Food Financing Initiative program that provides grants and loans, for the construction, rehabilitation, or expansion of independent grocery stores, supermarkets, community facilities, or other retail outlets to increase access to affordable fresh produce and other nutritious food in underserved communities. Annual DEC Compliance

We kindly remind you that in order to maintain compliance with Florida Statutes and FDP Bylaws, your DEC needs to submit documents to both your county Supervisor of Elections (SOE) office and the Florida Democratic Party. Everyone should have already turned in a completed a list of your local DEC Officers, Membership Roster, and Current Bylaws. If you have not submitted that information, please do so ASAP.

Below is a list of due dates for the rest of the compliance documents to be submitted to FDP. Please email partyaffairs@floridadems.org if you have any questions.

March 31, 2023: Your County Democratic Executive Committee EIN Number.

*Note: We are going to compile a spreadsheet with the EIN numbers from all the DECs in case they are lost or forgotten. If you do not know your number, we will help you obtain that information.

April 1, 2023: Audit of DEC income and expenses for the previous year.

April 1, 2023: Remit 20% of clubs' annual Party contribution to FDP, 201 S. Monroe St., Suite 300, Tallahassee, FL 32301 with "Club Party Contribution" noted in the memo field.

April 10, 2023; July 10, 2023; October 10, 2023; and January 10, 2024; and the Friday immediately proceeding each election: Financial reports of all contributions received, including in-kind contributions, and all expenditures made during the previous quarter. Please contact your SOE to inquire about your county's specific submission process.

A huge shoutout to the Collier, Bradford, Charlotte, Lee, Martin, St. Lucie, and Okeechobee DECs for sending in all the required compliance documents early.

FDP Communications

This week, Florida Democratic Party Chair Nikki Fried kicked off the legislative session with a [video](#) encouraging Democratic lawmakers to stand united in the fight against Ron DeSantis' extremism, while working to deliver results on the things Floridians care about most. As DeSantis delivered his State of the State address, we pushed back against his narrative by highlighting his real Florida blueprint and sending out fact checks of his record, including; his opposition to [local law enforcement funding](#), his support for [extreme abortion bans](#), his failure on [affordable housing](#), and his support for [dangerous gun laws](#). We also amplified the voices of our Democratic leaders, [Leader Book](#) and [Leader Driskell](#), who detailed ways they were going to fight back against Republicans in the House and Senate doing the bidding of Ron DeSantis. We also spoke out about DeSantis' doubling down on his book ban and stoking culture wars instead of working to fix the major educator shortage in Florida that has left [thousands of our students](#) without full-time teachers.
